The 5 Pillars of Islam

The Hadith of Angel Jibreel (peace be upon him) 'Abdullah bin 'Umar said:

"Umar bin Al-Khattab told me: 'While we were with the Messenger of Allah one day, a man appeared before us whose clothes were very white and whose hair was very black. We could see no signs of travel on him, but none of us knew him. He came and sat before the Messenger of Allah ﷺ, putting his knees against his, and placing his hands on his thighs, then he said:

"O Muhammad, tell me about Islam." He said:

"It is to bear witness that there is none worthy of worship except Allah ﷻ and that Muhammad ﷺ is the Messenger of Allah, to establish the Salah, to give Zakah, to fast Ramadan, and to perform Hajj to the House if you are able to bear the journey." He said: "You have spoken the truth." And we were amazed by his asking him, and then saying, "You have spoken the truth".

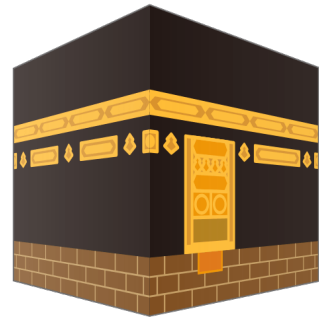

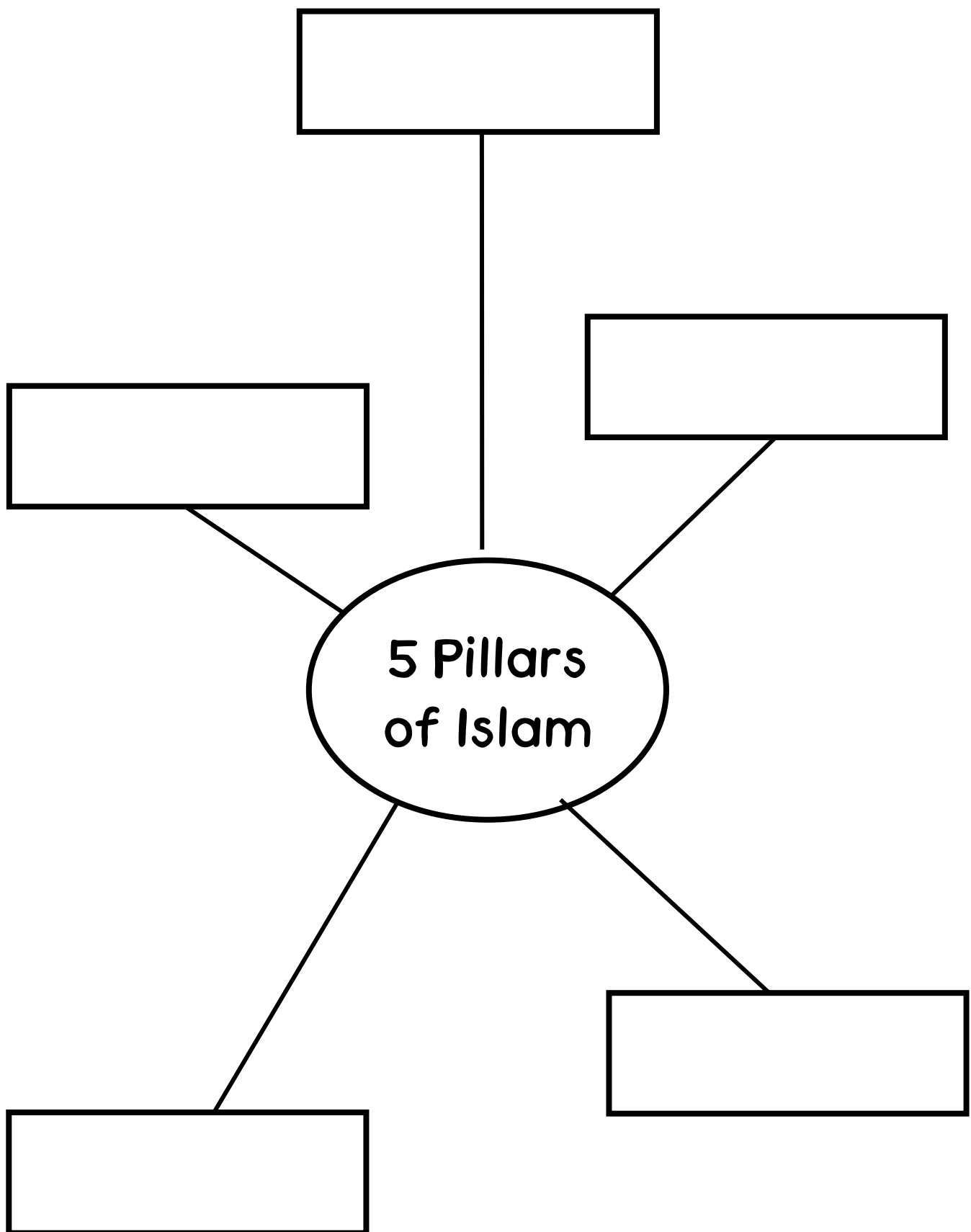

Welcoming Ramadhan

Shaykh Salih Al-Fawzan said:

It is befitting that a Muslim greets this month with happiness, delight, joy, praising Allah and seeking Allah's help to fast and do good deeds.

How do we verify when Ramadhan begins?

1. Sighting the moon
2. Check if it is cloudy

Allah The Exalted said:

"The month of Ramadân in which was revealed the Qur'ân, a guidance for mankind and clear proofs for the guidance and the criterion (between right and wrong). So whoever of you sights (the crescent on the first night of) the month (of Ramadân i.e. is present at his home), he must observe Saum (fasts) that month, and whoever is ill or on a journey, the same number [of days which one did not observe Saum (fasts) must be made up] from other days. Allâh intends for you ease, and He does not want to make things difficult for you. (He wants that you) must complete the same number (of days), and that you must magnify Allâh [i.e. to say Takbîr (Allâhu-Akbar; Allâh is the Most Great) for having guided you so that you may be grateful to Him."

(Quran: Surah 2, Ayah 185 – Translated by Muhsin Khan)

"They ask you (O Muhammad) about the new moons. Say: These are signs to mark fixed periods of time for mankind and for the pilgrimage."

(Quran: Surah 2, Ayah 189 – Translated by Muhsin Khan)









The Prophet sallallahu alaihi wa sallam said:

"When you see the new moon, then fast, and when you see it, break your fast: and if it is cloudy, complete the month."

(Hadith: Reported by Al-Bukhari and Muslim)

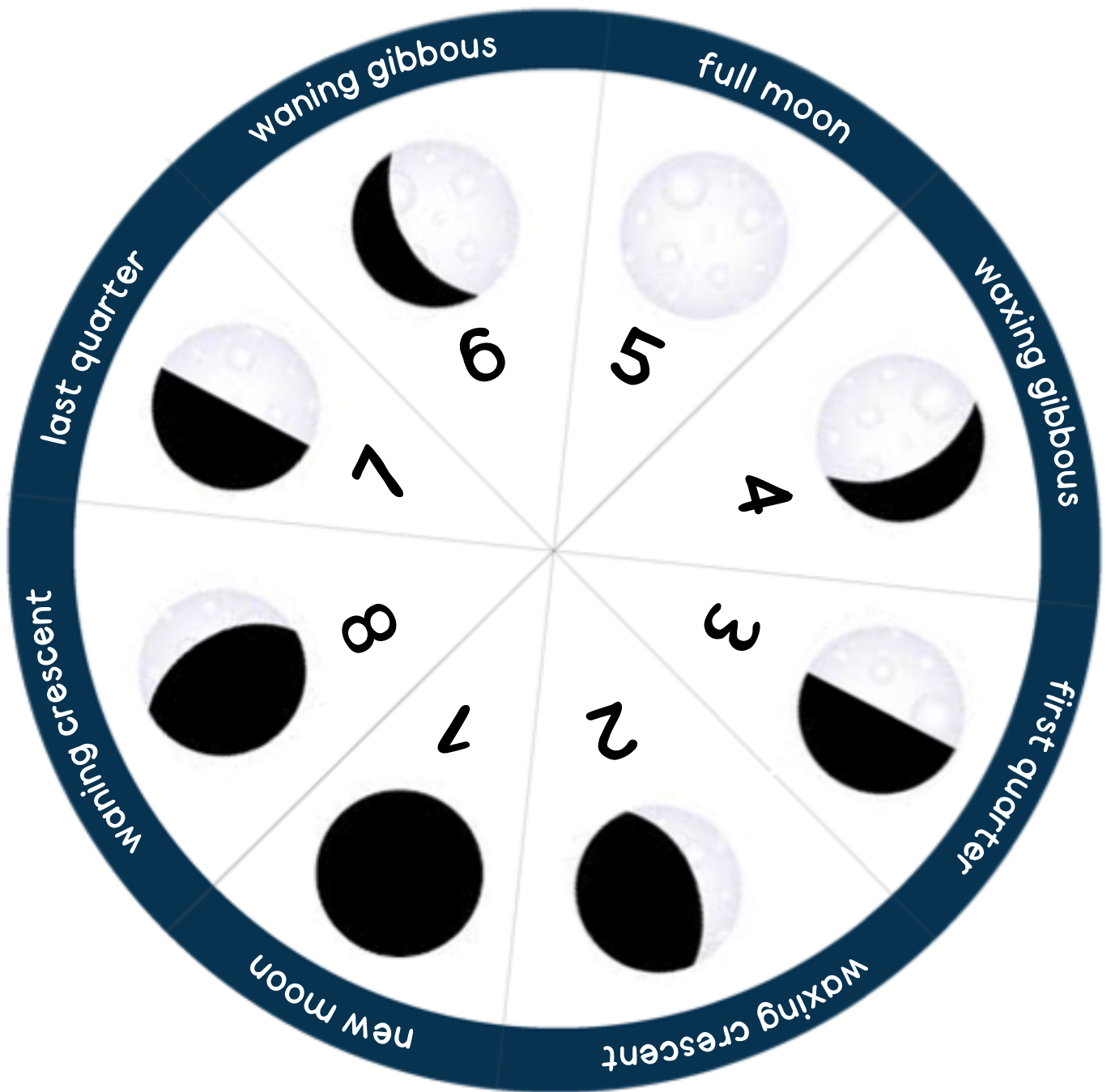

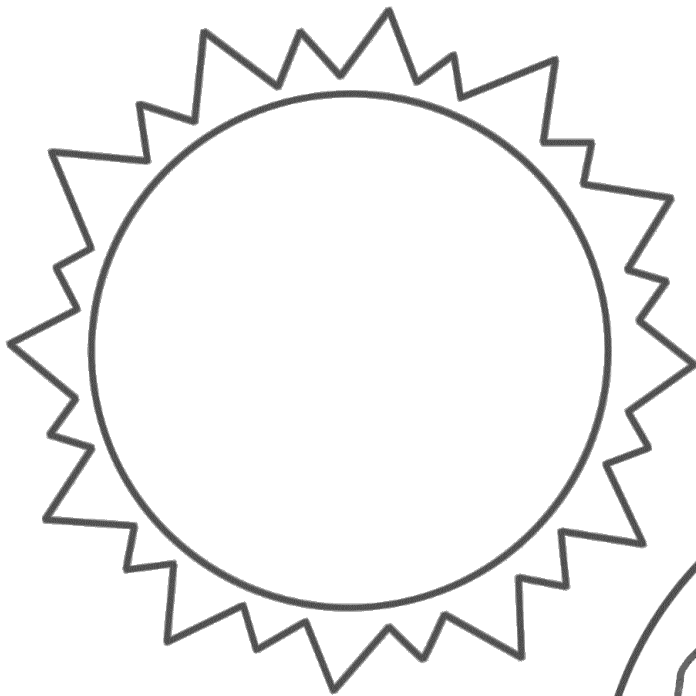

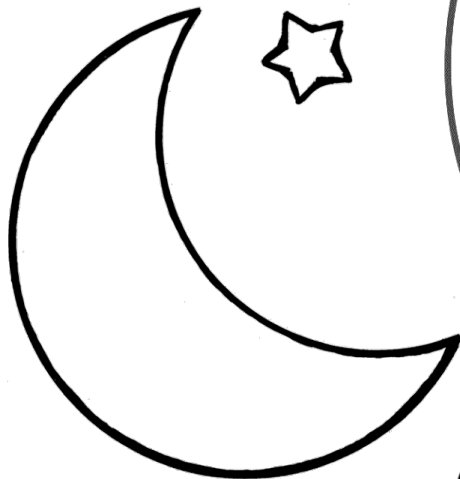

"One group of people meet this month by focusing on the market places so they can buy different types of foods...they buy more food than normal...wasting stunning amounts.

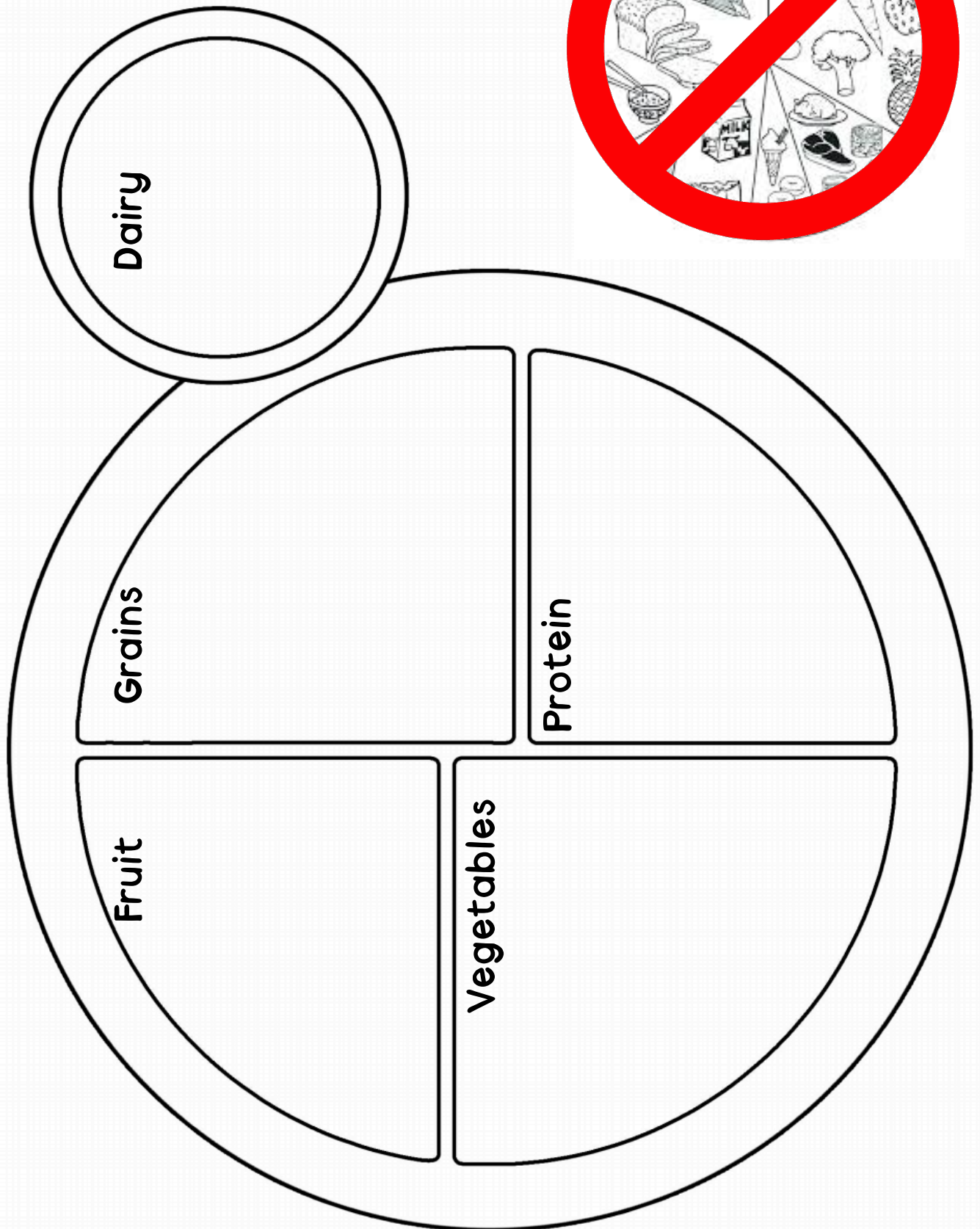
Another group of people prepare for themselves different forms of games, amusements and distractions...wasting their time with things which are of no benefit.

Virtues of Fasting:

The Prophet sallallahu alaihi wa sallam said:

Every action performed by the son of Adam can be multiplied in his favour from 10 to 70 times, and Allah the Exalted said: "Except for fasting, because verily it's for Me and I shall reward for it. He (the Muslim) leaves his desires, his food and his drink for My Sake, so the fasting person will have two times of happiness: happiness when he breaks his fast and happiness when he meets his Lord. And the smell that comes from the mouth of the fasting person is better in the sight of Allah than the fragrance of fine perfume."

(Sahih Bukhari and Muslim)

Abu Hurayrah reported that the Prophet sallallahu alaihi wa allam said:

"When the month of Ramadhan comes. the doors of Paradise are open, doors of Hell-Fire are closed, and the devils are chained up."

(Bukhari and Muslim)

It is the Month of Mercy and Forgiveness and good deeds are multiplied by many.

Fasting has many other benefits such as:

- Taqwa
- Protection from danger
- Patience
- Good health
- Discipline of the soul's desires
- Increase in Obedience (loving good, hating evil)
- Softens the hearts

Who should fast and who shouldn't?

It is obligatory upon every Muslim to fast the month of Ramadhan with the exception of a few.

Some of these people will either need to make up their fasts or pay an expiation for every day missed.

Allah Subhaanahu wa Ta'ala said:

O you who believe! Observing As-Saum (the fasting) is prescribed for you as it was prescribed for those before you, that you may become Al-Muttaqûn (the pious).

Observing Saum (fasts)] for a fixed number of days, but if any of you is ill or on a journey, the same number (should be made up) from other days. And as for those who can fast with difficulty, (e.g. an old man), they have (a choice either to fast or) to feed a Miskîn (poor person) (for every day). But whoever does good of his own accord, it is better for him. And that you fast, is better for you if only you know.

Allâh intends for you ease, and He does not want to make things difficult for you. 1. Make a sincere intention before fajr every day.
(Reported by Daraqutni in as-Sunan)
2. From fajr until maghrib, stay away from the following:
eating, drinking, desires, evil deeds (lying).
